The Christian Intervention Program (CIP)

What is it?

It is a substance abuse recovery program based on the premises that:

- we are loved and have high value in God's eyes
- God has a purpose and plan for us
- God can restore broken lives and families.

CIP is a 20 lesson program that presents topics such as:

- Who am I?
- Coping with the Problems of Life
- Parenting
- Firm Steps Toward Financial Freedom
- Building Self-Esteem
- What Alcohol and Drugs do to the Family
- Christian Values that Strengthen the Family
- Christian Morals and Values
- Developing Respect for Authority/Law Enforcement

When does the class meet?

The CIP class meets every Thursday at 7:00pm at the Brazil United Pentecostal Church at 1088 E US Hwy 40, Brazil, IN 47834, in the fellowship hall.

Participant cost

Students will purchase their student packet for \$30, which includes the student workbook, a CD, and a Bible.

What CIP offers

We have outreach packets available to distribute on the street/where the need is, that includes a CD with gospel music and a testimony of a former alcoholic, a booklet that provides the transcript of the testimony, a response card to send to us if they want help, and a toll-free number for 24 hour assistance from a counselor. That number is 1-800-535-6011.

We provide a one-lesson in-home introduction to CIP, or the 20-week program that meets on Thursday nights at 7:00pm in our church fellowship hall. It is both instructive on critical topics for

those recovering from addictions, but also provides an environment of peer support and accountability.

CIP at work

We have introduced CIP to the Clay County court and probation officers, Family Support Services, Systems of Care, the Clay County Substance Abuse Council (of which we are a member), Department of Child Services, the Indiana Attorney General, and plan to reach out to regional correctional facilities. CIP has been used in Clay County, as well as throughout the country by courts, departments of correction, parole officers, and companies as a faith-based alternative to offer alcohol and drug users a proven intervention/rehabilitation program.
