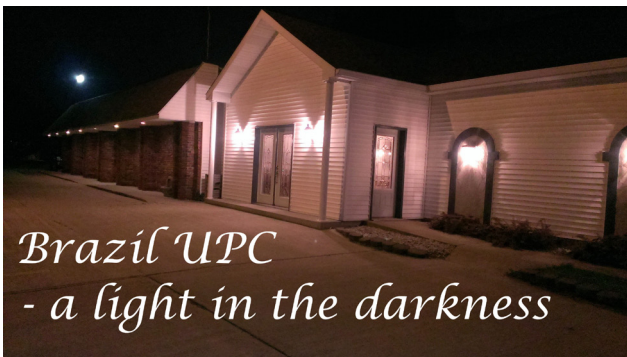

Youth Christian Intervention Program (YCIP)

What is it?

It is a teen addiction recovery program that recognizes that:

- teens are loved and have high value in God's eyes;
- God has a purpose and plan for them; and
- God restores broken lives and families.

YCIP is a 20 lesson program that presents topics such as:

- Who am I?
- Self-Esteem
- Relationship with Parents
- Building Respect
- Coping With Peer-pressure
- Handling Money
- Importance of Staying in School
- My Place in the Community
- The Power to Change

When does the class meet?

The YCIP class meets every Thursday at 7:00pm at the Brazil United Pentecostal Church at 1088 E US Hwy 40, Brazil, IN 47834, in the education hall.

Participant cost

Students must purchase their student packet for \$30, which includes the student workbook, a

“Raised from the Ruins” CD, and a Bible.

What YCIP offers

We provide a 20-week program that meets on Thursday nights at 7:00pm in the education hall. It is both instructive on critical topics for those recovering from addictions, but also provides an environment of peer support and accountability. Graduates of the program are awarded completion certificates at an honorary commencement ceremony.

CIP’s Success

Of the students who have graduated from CIP, the adult version of YCIP, 88% have found and have continued in freedom from addictions.

YCIP at work

We send monthly student prog-

ress reports to referring government or private agencies to assist with monitoring student’s progress.

The Adult CIP has been introduced to the Clay County court and probation officers, Family Support Services, Systems of Care, the Clay County Substance Abuse Council (of which we are a member), Department of Child Services, the Indiana Attorney General, the Rotary Club, and others. CIP has been used in Clay County, as well as throughout the country by courts, departments of correction, parole officers, and companies as a faith-based alternative to offer alcohol and drug users a proven intervention/rehabilitation program.
